Development Issue 1-2 Environmental Conservation	[Background and current situation] Brazil has not only the largest area of tropical forest in the world, the Amazon forest, but it also has important forests and natural environment for climate changes and biodiversity conservation. On the other hand, the conservation of forests and natural environment has become an issue due to the progress of development, illegal logging of forests, and forest fires, etc. (Average annual net loss of forest area is 150ha/yr (2010 - 2020), according to FAO), so effective measures are required to promote sustainable development including the preservation of the Amazon forest and natural environmental conservation.					[Strategy] Based on results from the cooperation already rendered by Japan, and aiming at the promotion of sustainable development including the protection of the forest and the natural environment, assistance will be provided to prevent illegal logging of forests and promote the preservation of forests and natural environment in Brazil.
